Paraphrasing, Summarizing, and Quoting

Paraphrasing, Summarizing, and Quoting Definitions Paraphrase = to capture the precise meaning of a text in your own words Summarize = to put the main idea(s) of a text in your own words Quote = to copy the exact words from another text Goals of each To understand what you are reading so that you can respond to, build on, and challenge it

What is a Paraphrase?

The following is an example of UNACCEPTABLE paraphrasing -- or plagiarism -- of the above passage: To paraphrase without plagiarizing, writers must - - Use their own words to convey the information - Use their own sentence structure - Cite the source and page number The following is an example of ACCEPTABLE paraphrasing of the above passage:

• Paraphrasing is also useful when dealing with material for which exact, detailed comprehension is required • Paraphrasing is helpful for understanding extremely difficult or complicated passages that must be worked out word by word An example of a paraphrase:

The Art of Paraphrasing Paraphrasing is the rewording of something to express it with greater clarity Paraphrasing is a skill you will want to have in your back pocket when you write a research article Paraphrasing is an efficient way to integrate multiple other works to support a claim you want to make

How to Paraphrase Paraphrasing is a writing skill in which you "rephrase" (rewrite) information from an outside source in your own words without changing its meaning Because you include in your rewriting all, or nearly all, of the content of the original passage, a paraphrase is almost as long When paraphrasing, it is important to avoid

Paraphrasing Correctly • When paraphrasing another author's text you must: - Accurately reflect the author's message - Cite the author's last name - Note the year of publication - Use your own words - Use your own sentence structure Quote Within a Paraphrase • Here's an example of a quote within a ...

Paraphrasing - LBCC

Paraphrasing Paraphrasing is restating a passage in simpler language In order to paraphrase well, you must read the passage carefully, understand the meaning of the passage, and rewrite the passage in your own words This process will help you improve both your reading and writing skills, for it forces you to read the passage closely

1 SUMMARIZING & PARAPHRASING: AVOIDING PLAGIARISM

Paraphrasing and Summarizing: Express ideas in a quicker, more straightforward way Avoid unnecessary details Condense large ideas into compact, easily understood chunks that can add to your writing Quotations: Restate someone else's ideas in a respectable, cited manner Clarify that a passage or phrase is not your own

Paraphrasing, why is it important? • Displays to the tutee that you are listening and understanding what they are speaking about • Ensures that your interpretation of the problem/concept is correct What are some good paraphrasing statements? Create a list of paraphrasing statements that you have heard throughout your life

QUOTING, SUMMARIZING, & PARAPHRASING

PARAPHRASE For paraphrasing, strive for brevity while capturing the idea of a sentence or paragraph's point (think "smaller picture," or local ideas)

For example, instead of quoting a whole paragraph, you might paraphrase the main idea in the paragraph in a sentence or two. It is also a common practice to paraphrase after providing a direct

Acknowledging, Paraphrasing, and Quoting Sources

Paraphrasing is often defined as putting a passage from an author into “your own words.” But what are your own words? How different must your paraphrase be from the original? The paragraphs below provide an example by showing a passage as it appears in the source (A), two paraphrases that follow the source too closely (B and C), and

Quotation, Paraphrase, and Summary

paraphrase Combining Quotation and Paraphrase More often than not, citations will involve some combination of paraphrase and quotation. For example, a paraphrased idea might contain within it brief quotes from the original passage. Combining quotation with paraphrase allows you to cite other writers while retaining control.

Summarizing, Paraphrasing, and Synthesizing Sources

Paraphrasing material retains the original ideas and length of a selection but allows you to restructure the information and use your own voice. A good paraphrase doesn't add to or detract from the original material but may help you understand it by putting its content into your own words.
